CHAMPIONS CROWNED AT VICTORY FIELD

2016 State Finals

This year's state finals enjoyed record attendance. Combined with a record Friday night crowd of 6,799, Saturday drew a three-game record 7,082 totaling 13,881, a new four-game mark.

On Friday night, an infield single with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning handed Roncalli a 3-2 win over Zionsville in the Class 4A state championship game. It was the first baseball state championship for the Rebels (23-9) and second-year coach Aaron Kroll. Zionsville took a 1-0 lead in the top of the fourth when pitcher Nick Prather singled up the middle scoring Nolan Elsbury. The teams traded runs on WP's in 5th and 6th innings. Roncalli's Nick Schnell's two-out triple to the left center wall in the sixth inning scored Hayden Harper knotting the score again at 2-2. Jacob Hurtubise of Zionsville High School was the L.V. Phillips Mental Attitude Award winner.

In 1A, Daleville earned its first state title in any sport. Senior pitcher Brandon Vermillion led the Broncos past Lanesville 4-0 in the Class A baseball championship game. He allowed just 4 hits, 11 K, and 1 BB. Daleville put up the game's first run in the top of the fourth inning with T.J. Price's solo HR. The Broncos would strike again in the top of the fifth when Elliott Jackson laced a 3-run double. The win was the 400th for Coach Terry Turner in 26 years. Brandon Vermillion of Daleville High School was the winner of this year's L.V. Phillips Mental

Attitude Award.

Jay Lorenz delivered a perfect bunt with the bases loaded in the bottom of the seventh inning to score teammate Jake Katchur, giving Providence a 7-6 win against Lafayette Central Catholic in the Class 2A baseball championship game. It was the first baseball state title for the Scott Hornung-coached Pioneers. The Knights were making their state-record ninth appearance in the state finals. LCC took a 3-1 lead through three innings. A five-run rally in the bottom of the fourth inning pushed the Pioneers in front 6-3. With one out, Brett Aria got an RBI on an HP, and Jake Lewis hit a line drive into center field scoring 3. Timmy Borden's sacrifice bunt then scored Lewis. The Knights tied the game two innings later. Anthony Berumen then drew an RBI walk and a throwing error to first allowed 2 more runs tying the game at 6. The two teams combined for a finals-record 17 walks. Tré Watson of Providence High School was the winner of this year's L.V. Phillips Mental Attitude Award.

In the 3A game, the Northview Knights (25-6) and head coach Craig Tout collected their first team state title of any kind in school history. They took a 2-1 lead into the bottom of the sixth. Braydon Tucker shut down Western in order in the top of the seventh to preserve the win, capping an impressive performance. He allowed just four hits and struck out nine. Western took a 1-0 lead in the top of the second inning on an RBI single by Jacob Douglass. Northview finally broke through in the bottom of the fifth. Luke Lancaster tied the game by scoring on an infield error. Northview then scored in the bottom of the 6th with two outs. Alex Reineohel drew a full-count walk and scored on Hayden France's bloop single into shallow right field.

SOUTH SWEEPS N/S ALL-STAR SERIES

Fifty of the top seniors from the State of Indiana reported to Whiting Oil Stadium for the 42nd annual All-Star Series.

In the opener, the South took an early 4-0 lead into the 2nd inning. The North tied it 5-5 in the 4th but couldn't hold on as the South scored runs in the 5th and 6th to win 7-6. Game two saw the South offense explode and jump out to a 9-0 lead

through 3 innings. The North couldn't overcome this as the South took game #2 15-2. Sunday's final game saw an extremely well played game as the South held a 3-2 lead through 8 innings. The South scored 3 in the 9th to complete the sweep with a 6-2 victory.

The Don Jennings MVP Award was presented to Kenton Crews of Heritage Hills High School. Who went

6-13 with 4 RBI's and 3 SB. Jostens will present Clay with a MVP ring.

The North maintains a 64-59 edge in the annual event.

Many thanks to Griffith head coach Brian Jennings and his staff, along with the countless other hands who helped make the 42nd annual North/South All-Star event special.

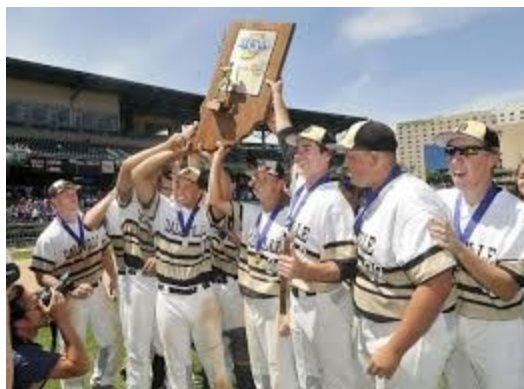

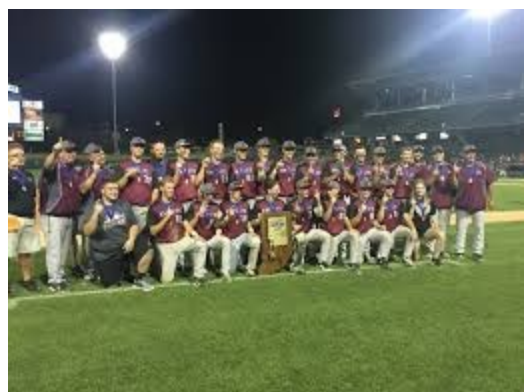

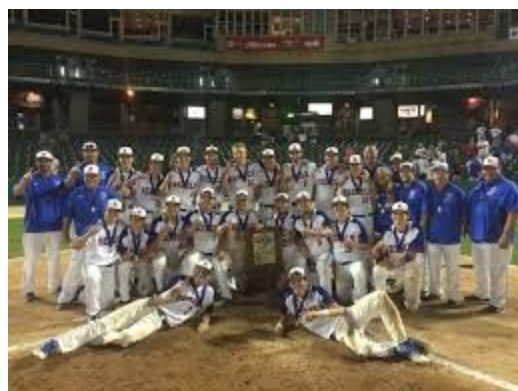

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR UPDATE

The IHSBCA leadership has been working with the IHSAA on the Participation Rule and the Pitch Count Rule. Both of these issues have involved discussions with members of our council and / or our association in general. Rule 15 (Participation Rule) has been the subject of two meetings so far and the third and final meeting will be held on August 25 at the IHSAA offices. This committee is comprised of the leadership of each coaches association in the state and several athletic directors. Recommended changes (if any) will be discussed at the October meeting of the IHSAA Executive Board.

Commissioner Cox recently addressed this question in an interview with the Indianapolis Star and it is very apparent that these concerns are real and not isolated.

This fall your Executive Council is going to have a 'retreat' and discuss all aspects of the IHSBCA and also how we can better serve our membership. We want to review everything we do (please share suggestions if you have them and some of you have already); discuss the needs of high school sports in the future; and how the IHSBCA needs to evolve from an organizational and a support standpoint. We don't want to continue to support antiquated philosophies; but rather retain what is working, honor our foundation in the process, and make changes that reflect the current climate of our sport. Please **send me** any comments / suggestions by September 30.

Thanks for all that you do for kids and the sport. Many of you coach youth teams, summer teams, work clinics, and have additional baseball responsibilities outside of the high school realm. You do it because you love baseball! Keep the love for the game strong and always remember why you are doing what you are doing.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHT—AJ Reed

AJ Reed got called up on June 25, 2016 with the Houston Astros. He is a 2011 graduate of Terre Haute South H.S. where he was the Indiana High School Player of the Year and the MVP of the North/South All-Star Series. He continued his career at the U. of Kentucky where he was the national player of the year in 2014. AJ was taken in the 2nd round (42nd overall) of the 2014 draft.
