# CHAMPIONS CROWNED AT VICTORY FIELD

### 2017 State Finals

This year's state finals enjoyed great attendance. Combined with the 2A Friday night crowd of 2,782, Saturday drew 6,664. Thus, totaling 9,446 for the weekend.

On Friday night, Indianapolis Cardinal Ritter plated three runs in both the third and fourth innings and went on to capture its first baseball state championship in a 10-4 decision over Wapahani at Victory Field in Indianapolis. Coached by 11th-year leader Dave Scott and Blake Malatestinic pitching all seven innings to finish his senior year 12-1, Ritter (28-3) earned the school's sixth state championship. Wapahani (19-12) under veteran skipper Brian Dudley (34 yr) was playing in the championship game for the second time in four seasons but settled for its second runner-up finish (2004 2A). Cardinal Ritter's senior Malatestinic was also selected as the L.V. Phillips Mental Attitude Award in 2A.

In 1A, a year after settling for a runner-up finish, Lanesville returned with a 5-1 victory over Rossville. It was the first state championship earned by a Lanesville team in any sport. The eighth-ranked Eagles (20-6) were coached by third-year leader Zach Payne. Scoreless through the first four frames, Lanesville exploded in a big fifth inning for five runs all with two outs. Third-ranked Rossville (24-9) got on the board in the bottom of the fifth when a bases loaded wild pitch plated a run for them. Cameron Harvey (9-2) went the distance on the mound for the Eagles striking out four and allowing three hits. Rossville's Matthew Homco was the L.V. Phillips Mental Attitude Award winner for 1A. South Bend St. Joseph scored a pair of runs in two different frames and shut out Jasper 4-0 to take the Class 3A Baseball State Championship. It was the school's 10th state championship overall but first in baseball. St. Joseph became the first South Bend school to play in a state championship game since South Bend Washington (1985) and first to win title since South Bend Clay (1970). John Gumpf is the 10th year leader of the Indians (25-4). St. Joseph's Michael Dunkelberger (7-2) held Jasper to just three hits and struck out four going the distance for the win. Second-ranked Jasper (30-5) was appearing in its state record-extending 16th baseball state finals under 30th year head coach Terry Gobert. It was the Wildcats' fourth runner-up finish to go along with their five state titles. Jasper's Evan Aders was named L.V. Phillips Mental Attitude Award in Class 3A.

In the 4A game, Evan Uhland's blast over the left field fence was the difference as Indianapolis Cathedral took a 4-3 extra inning victory from Penn in the Class 4A game. Uhland's solo homer off Penn pitcher Chase McKenzie led off the top of the eighth inning, broke a 3-3 deadlock and helped Cathedral complete a perfect 29-0 season. The Irish became the fourth undefeated state champion and first since 2007. It was the third baseball crown for the Irish (2001, 2007). Head coach Ed Freije. Penn (27-7) jumped in front in its first at-bat but Cathedral answered in the top of the second. The Irish added runs in the top of the fourth and fifth innings to take a 3-1 lead. Penn rallied in the bottom of the sixth inning with two runs to tie it at 3-3. It was the first loss in a state championship game for Penn and 30th year coach Greg Dikos after winning all four of its previous appearances. Penn's Trevor Waite named L.V. Phillips Mental Attitude Award in Class 4A.

# SOUTH TAKES 2 OF 3 IN N/S ALL-STAR SERIES

Fifty of the top seniors from the State of Indiana reported to Ball State University for the 43rd annual All-Star Series.

In the opener, the South took an early 4-0 lead into the 4th inning. The North cut into the lead in the 4th making it 4-2. The South scored insurance run in the 9th for a 5-2 win. Game two saw the North take a 2-1 lead in the 6th. The South proceeded to score 4 in the bottom of the 6th. The North scratched a run in the 8th but the South took game #2 5-3. Sunday's final game saw the wood bats come alive as the North took a 6-2 lead into the 7th. The South scored 3 in the 7th but the North piled on more and took a 11-6 victory.

The Don Jennings MVP Award was presented to Roy Thurman III from

North Central High School. Who went 6-13 with 4 RBI's and 3 SB. Jostens will present Roy with a MVP ring.

The North maintains a 66-61 edge in the annual event.

Many thanks to BSU head coach Rich Maloney, Wapahani head coach Brian Dudley, and Ball State who helped make the 43rd annual North/South All-Star event special.


